

Wapping Road

Parking Restrictions



July 2019

Bristol City Council has allocated funding to the alleviation of congestion issues related to the recent construction of the new cycleway on the West side of Wapping Road.

At present, the narrowing of the carriageway caused by the construction of the cycleway, in combination with the presence of parked vehicles on the East side of Wapping Road is preventing the free flow of two way traffic at peak times (evenings and weekends).

It is proposed that the short section of single yellow line on Wapping Road (no waiting Monday-Saturday 8am-6pm) should be replaced with double yellow lines (no waiting at any time), similar to those already covering the remainder of Wapping Road.

This scheme is being driven by:

- receipt of complaints from residents and the general public;
- a desire to keep Wapping Road clear, in order to maintain access for residents and the emergency services;
- a desire to improve road safety and air quality in the area by reducing congestion.



Please note that it is not currently proposed to change any of the other waiting or loading restrictions on or in the immediate vicinity of Wapping Road.

Comments in support of the scheme, as well as objections are valuable for the assessment of the proposals.

All suggestions and comments received will be taken into consideration and – if deemed to be appropriate – will be written into the proposed scheme.

The next step after the receipt of comments and revision of the scheme is the drafting of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), which is a legal requirement for the implementation of waiting restrictions. This can be a lengthy legal process which will involve placing a Notice of Intent in the local press and posting notices on site to advertise the proposals.

The manner in which the scheme will be taken forward will be decided by Bristol City Council (this scheme falls within Bristol City Council's Management of Place directorate), based on the results of this consultation.
